in the last month, 33 new Ukrainian students have joined Bible First!, our evangelistic correspondence course. Some sign up via paper fliers, and some online, but most (45%) actually enroll through the recommendation of existing students. Our historical enrollment now stands at well over a thousand, and we are more excited than ever about the fruit God is giving as we involve Ukrainians in the study of His Word. As you may recall,

one of our big goals for 2011 is to make *Bible First!* available in English to other churches and believers who would like to use it in ministry, and to that end, we have been working very diligently.

A Team Effort

We've been mailing out little paper Bible lessons for many years now. In the early days, our student base was much smaller and the workload was quite manageable. But as our course has grown, we've found ourselves increasingly challenged to maintain the delicate balance between ministry to our students and the development of new materials. On average, each time we release a new lesson there are between 50 and 60 students already waiting for it! This is one of many reasons why we are so grateful for the team God has given us here. It would be utterly impossible for one personor even a married couple - to keep pace alone.

Religious Visas

At long last it appears that we have found a solution to our immigration problems. In the past, all of our team members have held cultural visas lasting 3 - 5 years. About a year ago, the Ukrainian government made a policy change and decided they would no longer extend registration of cultural visas beyond the initial 90-day period. This effectively meant that we were all forced to leave the country every 90 days. While this was doable, the costs were beginning to add up. To make a long story short, the Lord has now opened the door for us to get religious visas instead. The main benefit of these new visas is that they allow us to stay in Ukraine for a full year without having to cross the border. Once our first year is up, we are hopeful that we will be able to apply for three-year visas. We are grateful to all of you who have prayed for us about this matter. God has answered!

Next Steps

Once upon a time, we thought it would be nice to have a Bible correspondence school with a couple hundred students. But over the past several years, God has grown not only our student roster but also our vision for what He wants to accomplish. The following is a brief look at a few of the doors that God is opening to us in Ukraine and around the world.

Launch in the U.S.

In addition to maintaining our Ukrainian ministries, our major focus right now is to publish an English version of Bible First! in the United States. We strongly believe that this tool could be a great blessing to churches all over America who are seeking to advance the Gospel and find those whose hearts are open to Christ. As advertised on our web site, our goal is to make Bible First! lessons available in the U.S. sometime this summer. Stay tuned for more updates. We're getting closer all the time!

Distribution in Ukraine

Recently, the Lord has opened several doors for me to speak with various Ukrainian Christian groups about *Bible First!* Most have responded very excitedly to the idea of implementing the course in their own churches, and they all ask that same magical question: "When can we get the materials?" Hopefully, very soon. We believe that if our ministry is to have a long-lasting effect in Ukraine, we need to get *Bible*

First! into the hands of Ukrainian believers and teach them how to do what we are doing. Imagine the impact of multiple Bible First! ministries spreading God's Word all over Ukraine!

Bible First! Online

Technology is quickly changing the way people communicate. Right now, most of our students are quite content to receive paper lessons in the mail. But a growing number are asking a very relevant question: "Can we get Bible First! lessons electronically?" Already we have seen great benefit in leveraging the internet for ministry purposes. As an example, for a few years now we have maintained a Ukrainian web site where people regularly sign up for our course and also request other materials. In the not-too-distant future, we would also like to make our entire correspondence course available on the internet. Rather than sending and receiving physical booklets by mail, students could set up an account and work through the course via a web-based app. This would reduce costs greatly, and as more and more people gain access to the internet, the scope of our potential impact would increase exponentially.
