

train car, stood at the front and began singing a Ukrainian folk song. Having finished their song, they walked slowly down the crowded aisle collecting coins from whomever was kind enough to give. This sight in itself was not unusual for Ukraine, but today was the third train trip during which I had seen these particular guys. For some reason, as I looked at them, the thought came that maybe I should have a chat with them. Maybe it was God who had brought us together these three times. Maybe we could win them.

As they passed our bench I handed them some coins and let them go. When they reached

the end of the car, they stepped through the main doors and into the exit area.

I followed, and found them standing together counting their money. I introduced myself, explaining that I was an English teacher, and we chatted for a few minutes. They told me their names were Andriy and Vitya, and I learned that they were also from L'viv. They had been friends since childhood, and apparently singing on trains was now their main source of income.

I led them back to our seat to meet Kelsie, and we ended our conversation by inviting them over for dinner the following week.

I wasn't sure exactly what to expect as it's not normally my

custom to invite singing train beggars home for dinner, but since God seemed to be leading this thing, we decided to follow Him.

As the agreed upon day approached, I wondered if they would really show up. Kelsie and I prepared our evening meal, set the table, and heard the bell ring right on schedule. In walked Andriy and Vitya: very shy, but very polite and obviously wondering what in the world would happen next. (Well, so was I!)

As we ate I explained that although we do teach English, our main goal is teaching the Bible. I made it clear that we were not offering them money or other humanitarian aid, but were simply interested in teaching the Bible. Would they like to come once a week and study with us? They surprised me by saying yes.

That night we finished dinner and spent the rest of the evening just chatting, playing games, and trying to get to know the guys a little. When the time came for them to leave, we agreed that they would come back the following Tuesday at 6:00pm.

Once again they arrived punctually, and we started our Bible study in Genesis 1. We read through the chapter verse by verse, and at the end I asked if they had any questions or comments. There was a brief discussion and we went on to chapter two.

Then one of our students named Oleg came up and asked if he could help us at all. As we explained our desire to find a larger meeting place, he said that he had a friend who was the director of a local middle school and thought that this friend would be willing to let us meet in his auditorium.

The following week the arrangements were made and we met with the director to discuss our desires. "Will it be a problem if a lot of people come?" he asked to my surprise. I assured him it would not, and he said that to start with he would like to assign thirty of his students to our existing group.

We believe that God is opening the doors for us to build new relationships with the people of this city, earn a hearing, and thus pave the way to introduce them to Jesus. Please pray that God will continue to bless our club, and that He will open the eyes of sinners to the Gospel.

Every Tuesday night since then, they have come faithfully and we are making our way through Genesis. A couple of

weeks ago, Andriy began telling me how he had read the Bible at times before, but said that he would always stop reading after a week or so. "I start getting scared," he said. "I know that the more I learn of God's Word, the more I am obligated to live by it. I know I don't live

like I ought and I'm afraid."

The Bible says, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." I am always glad when I see sinners understand the danger of being guilty before a just God.

We were able to explain to Andriy that while God is just and righteous, He is also merciful and has provided a way of salvation for all who believe. We went on to point out the error of trying to prepare oneself for God by reforming bad habits. Rather, God desires that the sinner acknowledge his hopeless state and turn for mercy right where he is.

When we said that, Andriy got a sort of far away look in his eyes, thought for a moment, and said, "Ah...that is really good!"
