Please excuse me if I did something wrong... I won't give the lesson to anyone else, but will return it to you with the answers. I'm waiting anxiously to receive lesson 4."

This is an excerpt from one of the many letters we receive every week from our Bible students here in Ukraine. The above student, a lady named Katrina, wrote us a different letter before this one, politely expressing her frustration at having to wait so long to receive her lessons. (The normal turn-around time is three weeks.) In that letter she said, "I hope that God will send you more responsible people who can fulfill their work (grading lessons and sending them out) for God..." We hope so too! As usual, laborers are few.

this is Nathan Day's responsibility, but as he is in the States, we will manage the course until he returns. We have both been amazed at the volume of mail we get in connection with the course. Completed lessons, letters with Bible questions, and new requests for enrollment fill our PO Box every week. Far from being apathetic, we have found that many of our students are quite enthusiastic about studying the Bible further. (Some are even impatient!) Recently, I spent a couple of hours on the computer answering a student named Oleg who had questions about the Trinity. He wrote us a three-page letter asking us to explain how Jesus could be one with the Father and yet still pray to Him while He was on earth. He was very sincere, and it was evident that he had studied the issue out well. Arguing with JW's who deny the Trinity is frustrating at best. In contrast, it is a great pleasure to open the Word of God and explain its truth to people like Oleg who are genuinely seeking.

In previous newsletters, we have shared with you how the average Ukrainian on the street responds to the Gospel - with coldness and indifference. However, the people who are enrolled in our Bible course have chosen of their own initiative to study the Bible. As they progress from one lesson to the next, we are thrilled to see their eyes opened by the power of God's Word. Truly the Bible does the greatest missionary work of all. We have watched time and again with delight and amazement as the Lord opens the hearts of sinners through the power of the Scriptures. We are committed to doing all we can to further that effort and to get solid Bible teaching into the hands of people all across Ukraine.

Please continue to pray for this effort. Pray also that God would send us more laborers. We have more work here than we can keep up with, and there are still thousands who are waiting to hear the Gospel. Thank you for interceding on our behalf as we continue to move forward.
