

athan and I approached the designated meeting point in central L'viv, prepared for another afternoon of tract distribution. Sergiy, one of our Bible students, had invited us to help him hand out tracts at a publisher's forum where he expected lots of students to congregate. While literature distribution is something rather routine for our team, today was unique in that Sergiy had been the initiator of this outreach. He arranged it. invited us, and even provided the tracts, which he had written and printed himself.

We met Sergiy at the agreed

upon time, and divided up the literature. Judging by the amount of people and the relatively small quantity of tracts, I didn't expect to be out very long. Little did we know that this day would soon prove to be unique in another, much less pleasant way.

The three of us split up, each taking a different area around the forum. Sergiy actually went inside the forum while Nathan and I stationed ourselves on opposite sides of the street, about 100 meters apart.

I had been handing out literature for about 20 minutes or so when my cell phone rang. It was

situation. The man who appeared to be the initiator responded antagonistically, "Yes, there is a problem." I tried for a couple of minutes to break up the confrontation explaining that we were just handing out literature and meant no offense. I could tell the men had been drinking, and I was hoping they would soon lose interest and go away.

Then, without warning, the man who had been talking with Nathan elbowed him hard in the stomach. I immediately landed a punch to the man's left temple and the fight was on. The first man turned his attention to me and shoved me against a wall. As I struggled to get free, the second man began advancing towards us to assist his friend. Unfortunately for him, he forgot about Nathan and walked right in front of him. Nathan hit him hard in the head

and they were soon locked in their own struggle.

Both these guys were considerably bigger than we were. Thankfully, I spotted some policemen and called for help. The police broke up the fight and began trying to determine who had been the aggressor. This question was not difficult to ascertain since, when the police arrived, both Nathan and I were pinned down, and tracts were scattered all over the pavement. Some of them even had blood on them.

We were all driven to the local police station where we gave an official account of our struggle and signed a few documents. Within an hour, we were back on the street, passing out the rest of our tracts.

Persecution here in Ukraine doesn't usually come in such blatant forms, but it is often just as vicious. The story we have related is unusual, but is nonetheless an

accurate example of the general attitude many take towards the preaching of the Gospel. Far from being received with open arms, we are often called "followers of a sect," much like the apostles were in the early church. Repentance towards God, reconciliation to Him, and deliverance from hell are not popular topics. But we do not serve here because our message is popular. We serve here in response to the command of our King to "teach all nations." (Matt. 28:19)

In spite of the opposition, we rejoice to report that there are those who are turning to Christ. Over 180 students are currently enrolled in our Bible course, and more responses are still coming in. We appreciate your continued intercession on our behalf as we proclaim Christ in Ukraine.
